





Ebola Preparedness in Tanzania Weekly Update

7 December 2018



- Monitoring of cross-border movements and traveller's entry screening using thermos-scanners and screening forms is on-going at Ports of Entry
- □ 66 health staff from Dar es Salaam region trained on case management and Safe and Dignified Burial
- □ 51 Shehia leaders, CHV supervisors and community group representatives in Zanzibar sensitized on their roles in EVD Risk Communication and Community engagement
- □ Supporting planning for training of health staff on EVD case management and IPC, surveillance, laboratory, contact tracing and risk communication in the remaining five high priority regions

Surveillance at Points of Entry

- No EVD case in URT
- No report of EVD suspected case
- Monitoring of cross-border movements and traveller's entry screening using thermos-scanners and screening forms is on-going:
 - ✓ 10 regions, 18 Districts, 23 POEs (Airports, Ports and Land borders) in mainland Tanzania
 - ✓ 4 regions, 6 Districts, 7 POEs (2 Airports and 5 Seaports) in Zanzibar
 - √ 724 travelers screened from DRC
 - ✓ 2 alerts were received but turned out to be false

Zanzibar

- □ Supported sensitization of 27 Shehia leaders (7) and supervisors (20) of Community Health Volunteers (CHVs) on their roles in facilitating EVD risk communication and community engagement including planning.
- ☐ Supported sensitization of 24 representatives of Traditional & Religious healers; Teachers; Motorbike riders; NGOs and Health Promoters on EVD risk communication and community engagement.
- ☐ In collaboration with UNICEF, facilitated review of the draft EVD IEC materials and EVD Contingency Plan (RCCE component)

Zanzibar


- ☐ Pretesting and printing of IEC materials for public education

Status of Ebola Virus Disease Outbreak in DRC


Status of Ebola Outbreak in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (as of 3 December 2018)


453 confirmed and probable EVD cases, including 268 deaths reported



- Outbreak is still evolving
- 405 confirmed cases and 48 probable with 268 deaths
- 144 cases cured and reintegrated into their communities
- A total of 41 health workers have been infected to date, including 12 deaths
- To date 39,845 have been vaccinated
- Major Challenges: Insecurity in affected areas compounded by pockets of misinformation, mistrust and community reluctance to adopt preventive measures. Inadequate infection prevention and control practices in healthcare settings also amplify spread of the disease.
