### HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (31/08/2020

- The entire country will remain in Stage 3 of the State of Emergency (29 August 2020 12 September 2020).
- A curfew (20h00-05h00) is applicable nationwide as from 29 August 2020 12 September 2020.
- Windhoek, Rehoboth and Okahandja Local Authority Areas are under travel restrictions (29 August 2020 12 September 2020)
- ➤ The Hosea Kutako International Airport will open as from 01 September 2020.

# Today Tested 1037 Confirmed 142 Active 4232 Recovered 52 Death 6

- Cumulatively, 7603 (98.8%) cases are local transmissions while 89 (1.2 %) are imported.
- There is community transmission in Erongo and Khomas regions.
- ➤ The other 12 regions are experiencing a sporadic transmission scenario. However, a rapid increase in confirmed cases was recorded in the last 3 weeks.
- More male cases 4221 (54.9%) were recorded compared to female cases 3471 (45.1%).
- To-date, **322 (4.2%)** Health Care Workers have tested positive for COVID-19.
  - 217 (67.4%) State
  - 104 (32.3%) Private
  - 1 (0.3%) NGO
- ➤ Today (31/08/2020), **52** recoveries have been recorded; 24 Khomas and 18 Hardap and 10 Ohangwena.
- Six (6) fatalities were recorded today from 3 regions; 3 Hardap, 2 Khomas and 1 Erongo (Health Care Worker).

- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; with Erongo reporting the highest 3472 (45.1%) followed by Khomas 3346 (43.5%).
- Khomas region is currently the epicenter of the outbreak.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 3379 (43.9%) have recovered.
- Cumulatively, 69 (85.2%) of the fatalities were known to have multiple co-morbidities (Table 2).




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases 31 August 2020

Namibia has recorded **7692** COVID-19 cases since 13 March 2020. Up to **2123** (**27.6%**) of the total cases were recorded during week 34 (Figure 1).

- A high number of cases were recorded in the past seven weeks as a result of:
  - -Spread of local transmission in the country
  - -Enhanced surveillance including active case search.
- Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily. Today, 1132 calls were answered including 18 alerts.

- To date, 60267 tests have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, and UNAM laboratories (including 3750 re-tests).
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 14497 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 406 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 9 regions.
- Cumulatively, **5769** contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total **771** (9.2%) of the contacts have tested positive
- Today, **5020 (58.8%)** out of **8539** active contacts were monitored.




Figure 2: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases in Namibia by District as of 31 August 2020

- The 20-49 years age- brackets constitute **5730 (74.5%)** of the confirmed cases, while a sizable proportion of the 50-59 age group **854 (11.1%).**
- Among those aged 30-39, a significant proportion of males 1207 (15.7%) are infected more than females 968 (12.6%).
- The under 5 make up 159 (2.1%) of the total cases.
- Aged 60 years and above constitute 322 (4.2%) of the confirmed cases.




Figure 3: Age and sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases

- Since March 2020, 10229 people have been placed into supervised quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of **1731** people are currently in quarantine with **72** new admissions in the past 24 hours.

- A total of **88** trucks entered the country through various ground crossing points in the last 24 hours.
- Of these trucks, 32 (36.4%) were heading to Erongo, 30 (34.1%) to Khomas while 8 (9.1%) were heading to //Kharas region.
- The remaining 18 (20.5%) were heading to the other 8 regions.

## PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION

- Recruitment of local volunteers into the response in the districts and regions is ongoing.
- Continuous support to the regions by the national level.
- > Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing

## CHALLENGES

- Large data backlog awaiting entry into excel data base and DHIS2.
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
- Inadequate ambulances in the regions.
- Inadequate isolation units, at health facilities in the regions.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

- Fast tracking of efforts to use GoData app and DHIS2.
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
- Procurement of ambulances in the regions to ensure prompt response.
- Establish fully equipped isolation units at health facilities in the regions.
