HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (20/09/2020)

- A total of 10526 cases have been recorded in a population of approximately 2.5 Million people, making it about 0.4% of the population infected.
- More male cases 5647 (53.6%) were recorded compared to female cases 4879 (46.4%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 436 (4.1%) Health Care Workers (HCWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 292 (67.0%) State; 143 (32.8%) Private, 1 (0.2%) NGO
- Today (20/09/2020), **79** recoveries have been recorded from 3 regions; the recovery rate now stands at **77.1%**.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions are reporting the highest with 4978 (47.3%) and 3794 (36.0%) respectively.
- Among the known contacts, 396 (4.0%) new confirmed cases have been reported during the last 7 days.




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases 20 September 2020

- To date, 88770 tests (including 4984 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, and UNAM laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 22208 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 65 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 9 regions.
- Cumulatively, 12178 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 1702 (17.3%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 7446 (75.7%) out of 9830 active contacts were monitored.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases
As of 20 September 2020

- Up to 2123 (20.2%) of the total cases were recorded during week 34 (Figure 1).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the mean number of confirmed cases from 303 to 94 in epi-week 38.
- Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily. Today, 1345 calls were answered including 14 alerts.
- > 75 alerts were received in the last 7 days.

- The 20-49 years age-brackets constitute 7652 (72.7%) of the confirmed cases, while a sizable proportion of the 50-59 age group is 1114 (10.6%).
- Among those aged 30-39 years, a significant proportion of males, 1618 (55.3%) are infected more than females 1307 (44.7%).
- The under 5 years make up **246 (2.3%)** of the total cases.
- Aged 60 years and above constitute **476** (**4.5%**) of the confirmed cases.

- Since March 2020, 13166 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 840 people are currently in quarantine with 14 new admissions in the past 24 hours.

- A total of 272 trucks entered the country through various ground crossing points in the last 24 hours.
- Of these trucks, 101 (37.1%) were heading to Khomas, 74 (27.2%) to //Kharas while 53 (19.5%) were heading to Erongo region.
- > The remaining 44 (16.2%) were heading to the other 8 regions.




Figure 3: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases in Namibia by District as of 20 September 2020

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Weekly engagements with regions to ensure readiness for effective response.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- Efforts on expanding the National testing capacity are ongoing.
- Response strategies for post State of Emergency are underway.

CHALLENGES

- Large data backlog awaiting entry into excel data base and DHIS2.
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
- Inadequate isolation units, at health facilities in the regions.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Fast tracking of efforts to use DHIS2 national-wide.
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
- Establish fully equipped isolation units at health facilities in the regions.
