

Epidemiological situation



Rwanda currently counts **4 896** cumulative confirmed cases with a **74%** recovery (10% up from last week), **0.2%** test positivity (0.5 up from last week) and **0.6%** death rates (0.2% up from last week). The Ministry of Health still counts **1259** active cases.

Gender distribution of cumulative confirmed cases shows

- Female are 35.56%. (0.5% down from last week)
- Male are 64.44%. (0.5 up from last week)

Age distribution of cumulative confirmed cases shows

- Positivity is still highest in cases that are 20 to 29 years at 32.4%
- Those between 30 and 39 representing 30.8%.
- Individuals age below 20 represent 11.1%
- Those from 40 to over 80 year of age represent 25.5% of the total confirmed cases.
