

## HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (26/10/2020)



- A total of 12729 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 0.5% of the population of approximately 2.5 Million. of Namibia. More male cases 7012 (55.1%) were recorded compared to female cases 5717 (45.9%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 516 (4.1%) Health Care Workers (HCWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date. -334 (64.7%) State; 179 (34.8%) Private, 3 (0.6%) NGO
  - -280 (54.4%) recoveries including 3 (0.6%) deaths.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 5783 (45.4%) and 3932 (30.9%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 104 (78.2%) are COVID-19 deaths while 29 (21.8%) are COVID-19 related deaths.
- > Today (26/10/2020), 65 recoveries have been recorded from 4 regions; the recovery rate now stands at 85.5%.
- The cases continue to flare up among closed settings such as school premises and hostels, police holding cells, and prisons.




Figure 1: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases by District, 26 October 2020

- To date, 122390 tests (including (6135 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM and Namib Poultry laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 30483 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 27 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 8 regions.
- Cumulatively, 23131 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 3062 (24.1%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- > Today, 6232 (83.2%) out of 7493 active contacts were monitored.

- Since March 2020, 18219 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 743 people are currently in quarantine, with 121 new admissions in the last 24 hours.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 9025 (70.9%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- ➤ The under 5 years age group make up 309 (2.4%) of the total cases whereas, 568 (4.5%) are above 60years of age.
- A total of 1553 (12.2%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.




Figure 3: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, as of 26 October 2020




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, As of 26 October 2020

- A highest peak of 2123 (16.7%) cases was recorded during week 34 (Figure 3).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases to 52 in epi-week 43.
- The National Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily.

Today (26/10/2020), 997 calls were answered including 101 alerts.

## PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Commencement of the GO.DATA training for technical teams in collaboration with WHO and RKI.
- > Announcement of new policy by government on entry requirement for travelers to Namibia.
- > Training on Case management and IPC for healthcare workers is ongoing with support from the Robert Koch Institute (RKI).
- Virtual training on Integrated Disease Surveillance Response (IDSR) is ongoing country-wide.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services

## **CHALLENGES**

- Lack of isolation units and facilities in the country for special cases in closed settings such as police holding cells, prisons and school hostels.
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for identified special cases throughout the country.
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
