- A total of 13012 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 0.5% of the population of approximately 2.5 Million people.
- More male cases 7171 (55.1%) were recorded compared to female cases 5841 (44.9%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, **521 (4.0%)** Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date. -339 (65.0%) State; 179 (34.4%) Private, 3 (0.6%) NGO.
 - -280 (54.4%) recoveries including 3 (0.6%) deaths.
 - Today (01/11/2020), 161 recoveries have been recorded from 4 regions; the recovery rate now stands at 86.1%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 5858 (45.0%) and 3953 (30.4%) respectively.
- ➤ Of the total fatalities, 104 (78.2%) are COVID-19 deaths while 29 (21.8%) are COVID-19 related deaths.
- > The cases continue to flare up among closed settings such as school premises and hostels, police holding cells, and prisons.
- Among the known contacts, 113 (0.9%) new confirmed cases have been reported during the last 7 days.

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, as of 01 November 2020

- A highest peak of 2123 (16.3%) cases was recorded during week 34 (Figure 1).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases to 47 in epiweek 44.
- The National Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily.

Today (01/11/2020), **836** calls were answered including **75** alerts.

- To date, 127724 tests (including (6277 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM and Namib Poultry laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 31047 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 99 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 9 regions.
- Cumulatively, 24161 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 3170 (24.4%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 5897 (82.6%) out of 7140 active contacts were monitored.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 9208 (70.8%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- The under 5 years age group make up 317 (2.4%) of the total cases whereas, 581 (4.5%) are above 60 years of age.
- A total of 1603 (12.3%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 01 November 2020

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- > Virtual training on Integrated Disease Surveillance Response (IDSR) is ongoing country-wide.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services

CHALLENGES

- Refusal of swabbing by some people
- Lack of isolation units and facilities in the country for special cases in closed settings such as police holding cells and prisons.
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Strengthening of awareness measures on the importance of testing.
- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for identified special cases throughout the country.
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
