- A total of 13508 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 0.5% of the population.
- More male cases 7424 (55.0%) were recorded compared to female cases 6084 (45.0%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 533 (3.9%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 347 (65.1%) State; 183 (34.3%) Private, 3 (0.6%) Non-Government Organisations.
 - 280 (53.3%) recoveries and 3 (0.6%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 93.9%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 6033 (44.7%) and 3985 (29.5%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 107 (77.5%) are COVID-19 deaths while 31 (22.5%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

- A highest peak of 2123 (15.7%) cases was recorded during week 34 (Figure 1).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases to 32 in epi-week 45.
- The number of cases have plateaued in the last four weeks as seen in the graph.
- The National Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily.

Today (14/11/2020), 681 calls were answered including 77 alerts.





Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 14 November 2020

- To date, 140064 tests (including (6582 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM and Namib Poultry laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 33100 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 181 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 11 regions.
- Cumulatively, 30372 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 4086 (30.2%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 1964 (79.8%) out of 2462 active contacts were monitored.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 9506 (70.4%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes
- A total of **1687** (**12.5%**) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.

the majority of the recorded cases.

The under 5 years age group make up 334 (2.5%) of the total cases whereas, 618 (4.6%) are above 60 years of age.

- Since March 2020, 19535 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 414 people are currently quarantine, with 152 new admissions in the last 24 hours.

- Virtual training on Integrated Disease Surveillance Response (IDSR) is ongoing country-wide.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

Lack of isolation units and facilities in the country for special cases in closed settings such as police holding cells and prisons.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for identified special cases throughout the country.


