

- A total of 12293 cases have been recorded in a population of approximately 2.5 Million people, making it about 0.5% of the population infected.
- More male cases 6703 (54.5%) were recorded compared to female cases 5590 (45.5%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 483 (3.9%) Health Care Workers (HCWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 311 (64.4%) State; 169 (35.0%) Private, 3 (0.6%) NGO
- Today (17/10/2020), 3 recoveries have been recorded from 2 regions region; the recovery rate now stands at 84.8%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 5685 (46.2%) and 3905 (31.8%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 102 (77.8%) are COVID-19 deaths while 29 (22.1%) are COVID-19 related deaths.
- The cases continue to erupt among closed settings such as schools, police holding cells and prisons.

- A highest peak of 2123 (17.3%) cases was recorded during week 34 (Figure 2).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases to 44 in epi-week 41.
- The National Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily.

Today (17/10/2020), 1010 calls were answered including 100 alerts.

Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, as of 17 October 2020




Figure 1: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases by District, 17 October 2020

- To date, 114845 tests (including (5974 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM and Namib Poultry laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 29132 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 86 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 10 regions.
- Cumulatively, 21780 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 2986 (10.25%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 6243 (83.63%) out of 7465 active contacts were monitored.

- Since March 2020, 17269 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 971 people are currently in quarantine, with 46 new admissions in the last 24 hours.

- The 20-49 years age-brackets constitute 8761 (71.3%) of the confirmed cases, while a sizable proportion of the 50-59 age group is 1249 (10.2%).
- A total of 1455 (11.6%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years make up 301 (2.4%) of the total cases.
- Aged 60 years and above constitute 555 (4.5%) of the confirmed cases.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, As of 17 October 2020

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Meeting held by the National Health Emergency Management Committee to review the current public health regulations on COVI-19.
- > Training on Integrated Disease Surveillance Response (IDSR) is ongoing country-wide.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services

CHALLENGES

- Lack of isolation units and facilities in the country for special cases in closed settings such as police holding cells and prisons.
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for identified special cases throughout the country.
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
