- A total of 13712 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 0.5% of the population.
- More male cases 7534 (54.9%) were recorded compared to female cases 6178 (45.1%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 536 (3.9%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 350 (65.3%) State; 183 (34.2%) Private, 3 (0.6%) Non-Government Organisations.
 - 452 (84.3%) recoveries and 3 (0.6%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 96.2%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 6112 (44.6%) and 4000 (29.2%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 110 (76.9%) are COVID-19 deaths while 33 (23.1%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, As of 19 November 2020

- Of the total confirmed cases, 9646 (70.3%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 1709 (12.5%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 336 (2.5%) of the total cases whereas, 638 (4.7%) are above 60 years of age.

- A highest peak of 2123 (15.5%) cases was recorded during week 34 (Figure 1).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases to 42 in epi-week 46.
- The number of cases have plateaued in the last four weeks as seen in the graph.
- The National Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily.

Today (19/11/2020), **728** calls were answered including **57** alerts.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 19 November 2020

- To date, 144180 tests (including (6654 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM and Namib Poultry laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 34738 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 16 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 11 regions.
- Cumulatively, 32131 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 4277 (31.2%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 1937 (71.0%) out of 2727 active contacts were monitored.

- Since March 2020, 19874 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 530 people are currently in quarantine, with 204 new admissions in the last 24 hours.


