HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (24/11/2020)

- A total of 14006 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 0.6% of the population.
- More male cases 7675 (54.8%) were recorded compared to female cases 6331 (45.2%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 547 (3.9%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 359 (65.6%) State; 185 (33.8%) Private, 3 (0.5%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 452 (82.6%) recoveries and 3 (0.5%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 95.2%
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 6251 (44.6%) and 4034 (28.8%) respectively.
 - Of the total fatalities, 112 (77.2%) are COVID-19 deaths while 33 (22.8%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases
As of 24 November 2020

- Of the total confirmed cases, 9787 (69.9%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **1810** (**12.9%**) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 341 (2.4%) of the total cases whereas, 657 (4.7%) are above 60 years of age.

- A highest peak of 2123 (15.2%) cases was recorded during week 34 (Figure 1).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country saw a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases up to week 44 after which a rise started again.
- The National Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily.

Today (24/11/2020), 773 calls were answered including 67 alerts.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases. as of 24 November 2020

- To date, 149041 tests (including 6721 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM and Namib Poultry laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 35469 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 75 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 32755 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 4332 (30.9%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 2124 (71.2%) out of 2982 active contacts were monitored.

Table 3: Number of people in mandatory quarantine facilities, 24 November 2020

- Since March 2020, 20124 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 450 people are currently in quarantine, with 55 new admissions in the last 24 hours.

CHALLENGES

Lack of isolation units and facilities in the country for special cases in closed settings such as police holding cells and prisons. RECOMMENDATIONS

Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for identified special cases throughout the country.
