


Definitions and abbreviations

Unsafe abortions averted due to modern contraceptive use: Number of unsafe abortions that did not occur during a specified reference period as a result of the protection provided by modern contraceptive use during the reference period. Contraceptive prevalence - Modern Methods: Percentage of women of reproductive age who are using (or whose partner is

using) a modern contraceptive method at a particular point in time

Unmet need: percentage of fecund women of reproductive age who want no more children or to postpone having the next child, but are not using a contraceptive method, plus women who are currently using a traditional method of family planning FP - Family planning, MMR - Maternal Mortality Ratio
