HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (11/01/2021)

- A total of 28871 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 1% of the population.
- More male cases 14661 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 14210 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1350 (5%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 1021 (76%) State; 325 (24%) Private, 4 (0.3%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 960 (71%) recoveries and 6 (0.5%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 86%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 13060 (45%) and 6250 (22%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 216 (82%) are COVID-19 deaths while 48 (18%) are COVID-19 related deaths.



- To date, 229500 tests (including 10199 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 53073 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 721 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 14 regions.
- Cumulatively, 46317 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 6284 (22%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- > Today, **5243 (81%)** out of **6500** active contacts monitored.

A highest peak of 3485 (12%) cases was recorded during week 54 (Figure 1).




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 11 January 2021





- Of the total confirmed cases, 20047 (69%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 3364 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make 659 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 1769 (6%) are above 60 years

- Since March 2020, 27684 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 2089 people are currently in quarantine, with 151 new admissions.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- Lack of isolation units and facilities in the regions.
- Non-adherence to COVID-19 prevention measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities throughout the country.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
