HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (24/12/2020)

- A total of 21262 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 0.9% of the population.
- More male cases 11107 (52.2%) were recorded compared to female cases 10155 (47.8%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 896 (4.4%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 623 (69.5%) State; 269 (30.0%) Private, 4 (0.5%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 574 (64.1%) recoveries and 3 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 82.8%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 10347 (48.7%) and 4898 (23.0%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 144 (77%) are COVID-19 deaths while 43 (23%) are COVID-19 related deaths.



- A highest peak of 2548 (11.9%) cases was recorded during week 52 (Figure 1).
- The National Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily.

Today (24/12/2020) 881 calls were answered including 61 alerts.





Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 24 December 2020

- To date, 196254 tests (including 7902 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 44884 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 243 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 8 regions.
- Cumulatively, 38921 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 5158 (24.3%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 5710 (99.5%) out of 5736 active contacts monitored.

As of 24 December 2020

- Of the total confirmed cases, 14959 (70.4%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 2594 (1.2.2%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make 457 (2.1%) of the total cases whereas, 1082 (5.1%) are above 60 years of age.

- Since March 2020, 24215 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1590 people are currently in quarantine, with 198 new admissions.

CHALLENGES

- > Lack of isolation units and facilities in the regions.

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities throughout the country.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures.
