HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (12/01/2021)

- A total of 29183 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 1% of the population.
- More male cases 14835 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 14348 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1367 (5%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 1037 (76%) State; 326 (24%) Private, 4 (0.3%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 960 (70%) recoveries and 6 (0.4%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 87%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 13133 (45%) and 6299 (22%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 223 (82%) are COVID-19 deaths while 48 (18%) are COVID-19 related deaths.






- To date, 231208 tests (including 10315 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, **53837** contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, **690** new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 13 regions.
- Cumulatively, 40654 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 6363 (22%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 5391 (82%) out of 6567 active contacts monitored.







Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 12 January 2021




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases

- Of the total confirmed cases, 20260 (69%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 3394 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make 663 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 1795 (6%) are above 60 years
