

HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (29/01/2021)



- A total of 33832 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 1% of the population.
- More male cases 17094 (50%) were recorded compared to female cases 16738 (50%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1612 (5%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 todate.
 - 1238 (77%) State; 370 (23%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1463 (91%) recoveries and 6 (0.4%) deaths.
- > The recovery rate now stands at 95%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 14315 (42%) and 6889 (20%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 286 (82%) are COVID-19 deaths while 64 (18%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

- To date, 261587 tests (including 11241 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 61402 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 399 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 10 regions.
- Cumulatively, 56055 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 7695 (23%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 3270 (64%) out of 5080 active contacts monitored.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 23239 (69%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 4052 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make 788 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2168 (6%) are above 60 years of age.





Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 29 January 2021



A highest peak of 3485 (10%) cases was recorded during week 54 (Figure 2).

The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.

Today (29/01/2021), 675 calls were answered including 91 alerts.

- Since March 2020, 31108 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- > A total of 1159 people are currently in quarantine, with 26 new admissions.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Mechanisms are underway on how to roll out the vaccine nationwide once it is made available.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- > The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- Lack of isolation units and facilities in the regions.
- Non-adherence to COVID-19 prevention measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities throughout the country.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
