- More male cases 17825 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 17376 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1661 (5%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 1276 (77%) State; 377 (23%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1598 (96%) recoveries and 6 (0.4%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 96%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 14625 (42%) and 7128 (20%) respectively.
- > Of the total fatalities, 304 (81%) are COVID-19 deaths while 73 (19%) are COVID-19 related deaths.



- To date, 273805 tests (including 11382 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 63912 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 373 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 14 regions.
- Cumulatively, 59558 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 8209 (23%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 275 (7%) out of 3815 active contacts monitored.

Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, As of 08 February 2021




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 08 February 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 24104 (68%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 4266 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make 820 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2282 (6%) are above 60 years of age.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Mechanisms are underway on how to roll out the vaccine nationwide once it is made available.
- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services.
