- A total of 33459 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 1% of the population.
- More male cases 16884 (50%) were recorded compared to female cases 16575 (50%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1598 (5%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 1224 (77%) State; 370 (23%) Private, 4 (0.3%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1463 (77%) recoveries and 6 (0.4%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 94%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 14222 (43%) and 6844 (20%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 273 (82%) are COVID-19 deaths while 59 (18%) are COVID-19 related deaths.



- To date, 258220 tests (including 11194 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 60399 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 224 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- have Cumulatively, 55102 contacts completed their monitoring period, while a total of 7547 (23%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 4194 (81%) out of 5156 active contacts monitored.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 23000 (69%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 4008 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make 777 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2134 (6%) are above 60 years of age.

A highest peak of 3485 (10%) cases was recorded during week 54 (Figure 2).

The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.

Today (27/01/2021), 637 calls were answered including 83 alerts.

- Since March 2020, 30912 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1216 people are currently in quarantine, with 326 new admissions.

- Lack of isolation units and facilities in the regions.

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities throughout the country.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
