HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (30/01/2021)



- A total of 33944 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 1% of the population.
- More male cases 17172 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 16772 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1612 (5%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 1238 (77%) State; 370 (23%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1463 (91%) recoveries and 6 (0.4%) deaths.
- > The recovery rate now stands at 95%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 14331 (42%) and 6942 (20%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 287 (81%) are COVID-19 deaths while 66 (19%) are COVID-19 related deaths.



- To date, 262690 tests (including 11265 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 61476 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 165 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 9 regions.
- Cumulatively, 56220 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 7721 (23%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 3518 (71%) out of 4965 active contacts monitored.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 23308 (69%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 4064 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make 790 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2179 (6%) are above 60 years of age.






Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 30 January 2021

A highest peak of 3485 (10%) cases was recorded during week 53 (Figure 2).

The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.

Today (30/01/2021), **638** calls were answered including **79** alerts.

- Since March 2020, 31110 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1152 people are currently in quarantine, with 2 new admissions.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Mechanisms are underway on how to roll out the vaccine nationwide once it is made available.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- > The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- Lack of isolation units and facilities in the regions.
- Non-adherence to COVID-19 prevention measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities throughout the country.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
