## **HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (04/02/2021)**





- A total of 34615 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 1% of the population.
- ➤ More male cases 17513 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 17102 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1645 (5%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
  - 1264 (77%) State; 373 (23%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
  - 1598 (97%) recoveries and 6 (0.4%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 96%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 14495 (42%) and 7019 (20%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 300 (81%) are COVID-19 deaths while 70 (19%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

- To date, 269151 tests (including 11314 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 63011 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 313 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 58815 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 7998 (23%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 2327 (63%) out of 3677 active contacts monitored.

- Since March 2020, 31942 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1218 people are currently in quarantine, with 292 new admissions.




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases

A highest peak of 3485 (10%) cases was recorded during week 53 (Figure 1).

The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.

Today (04/02/2021), **650** calls were answered including **84** alerts.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 04 February 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 23750 (69%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 4149 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make 803 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2242 (6%) are above 60 years of age.

## **PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)**

- Mechanisms are underway on how to roll out the vaccine nationwide once it is made available.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services.

## CHALLENGES

- Lack of isolation units and facilities in the regions.
- Non-adherence to COVID-19 prevention measures by the general public.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities throughout the country.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
