HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (10/02/2021)

- A total of 35353 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 1% of the population.
- More male cases 17911 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 17442 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1667 (5%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 1282 (77%) State; 377 (23%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - > 1598 (96%) recoveries and 6 (0.4%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 96%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 14691 (42%) and 7142 (20%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 309 (81%) are COVID-19 deaths while 73 (19%) are COVID-19 related deaths.





- Since March 2020, 32701 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1250 people are currently in quarantine, with 251 new admissions.





Of the total confirmed cases, 24209 (68%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.

- A total of 4218 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make 826 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2292 (6%) are above 60 years of age.

- To date, 276043 tests (including 11397 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 64627 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 191 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 11 regions.
- Cumulatively, 60117 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 8463 (24%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 1981 (50%) out of 3990 active contacts monitored.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Mechanisms are underway on how to roll out the vaccine nationwide once it is made available.
- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

Non-adherence to COVID-19 prevention measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
