

HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (22/02/2021)



- A total of 37896 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- More male cases 19310 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 18586 (49%).
- ➤ Of the total confirmed cases, 1721 (5%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 1327 (77%) State; 386 (22%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1648 (96%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- > The recovery rate now stands at 93%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 15034 (40%) and 7353 (19%) respectively.
- ➤ Of the total fatalities, 324 (79%) are COVID-19 deaths while 87 (21%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, As of 22 February 2021

A highest peak of 3485 (9%) cases was recorded during week 54 (Figure 1).

The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.

Today (22/02/2021), 328 calls were answered including 49 alerts.




Figure 2: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, As of 22 February 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 25272 (67%) are in the 20-49 years agebrackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 5436 (14%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make 867 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2383 (6%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 22 February 2021

- To date, 292325 tests (including 11487 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 68352 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 252 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 64053 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 9221 (24%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 1706 (44%) out of 3858 active contacts monitored.

Table 3: Number of people in mandatory quarantine facilities, 22 February 2021

- Since March 2020, 34880 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1777 people are currently in quarantine, with 150 new admissions.
