

- A total of 41424 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- More male cases 20940 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 20484 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1858 (4%) are Health Workers (HWs).
  - 1453 (78%) State; 401 (22%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
  - 1749 (94%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 93%.
- > All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 15757 (38%) and 7666 (19%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 371 (80%) are COVID-19 deaths while 94 (20%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

## **EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA**




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 14 March 2021

The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.

Today (14/03/2021), **539** calls were answered including **13** alerts.

A highest peak of **3485** (8%) cases was recorded during week 1 in 2021 (Figure 1).

Of the total confirmed cases, 26956 (65%) are in the 20-49 years agebrackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.

A total of **6652** (**16%**) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.

The under 5 years age group make up 945 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2608 (6%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 14 March 2021

To date, **321032** tests (including **11661** re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath and Central Veterinary laboratories.

Since the beginning of the outbreak, 74448 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 223 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 13 regions.

Cumulatively, **70209** contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of **10330** (25%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.

Today, 2089 (52%) out of 3989 active contacts monitored.

## RECOMMENDATIONS


Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
