# HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (02/03/2021)




- A total of 39297 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- ➤ More male cases 19948 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 19349 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1764 (4%) are Health Workers (HWs).
  - 1368 (78%) State; 392 (22%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
  - 1686 (96%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 94%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 15351 (39%) and 7475 (19%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 344 (79%) are COVID-19 deaths while 90 (21%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

### **EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA**



- Of the total confirmed cases, 25942 (66%) are in the 20-49 years agebrackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **5933** (**15%**) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 892 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2457 (6%) are above 60 years of age.

Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, 02 March 2021

- To date, 303412 tests (including 11652 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 70624 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 258 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 10 regions.
- Cumulatively, 66429 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 9595 (24%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 2444 (65%) out of 3764 active contacts monitored.




Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 02 March 2021

A highest peak of 3485 (9%) cases was recorded during week 1 in 2021 (Figure 2).

The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.

Today (02/03/2021), 579 calls were answered including 81 alerts.




Figure 3: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 02 March 2021
