
HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (05/03/2021)



- A total of 39877 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- More male cases 20210 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 19667 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1787 (4%) are Health Workers (HWs).
 - 1391 (78%) State; 392 (22%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1686 (94%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 94%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 15468 (39%) and 7521 (19%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 347 (79%) are COVID-19 deaths while 90 (21%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA



- Of the total confirmed cases, 26192 (66%) are in the 20-49 years agebrackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **6166** (**15%**) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 904 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2494 (6%) are above 60 years of age.


Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, 05 March 2021

- To date, 307781 tests (including 11597 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 71863 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 333 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 8 regions.
- Cumulatively, 67168 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 9776 (25%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 1799 (42%) out of 4248 active contacts monitored.

Today (05/03/2021), **579** calls were answered including **81** alerts.




Figure 3: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 05 March 2021
