

HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (09/03/2021)

- A total of 40451 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- More male cases 20477 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 19974 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1814 (4%) are Health Workers (HWs).
 - 1413 (78%) State; 397 (22%) Private. (0.2%)Governmental Organizations.
 - 1749 (96%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 94%.



- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 15588 (39%) and 7549 (19%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 356 (80%) are COVID-19 deaths while 92 (20%) are COVID-19 related deaths.




Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases



- Of the total confirmed cases, 26449 (65%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **6382 (16%)** of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up
 916 (2%) of the total cases whereas,
 2539 (6%) are above 60 years of age.

- To date, 312822 tests (including 11616 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 73325 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 465 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 14 regions.
- Cumulatively, 68990 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 10093 (25%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 3077 (76%) out of 4050 active contacts monitored.

A highest peak of 3485 (9%) cases was recorded during week 1 in 2021 (Figure 2).

The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.

Today (09/03/2021), 498 calls were answered including 17 alerts.




Figure 3: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 09 March 2021

RECOMMENDATIONS


Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
