HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (15/03/2021)



- A total of 41466 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- More male cases 20959 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 20507 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1863 (4%) are Health Workers (HWs).
 - 1458 (78%) State; 401 (22%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1749 (94%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 94%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 15768 (38%) and 7669 (18%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 379 (80%) are COVID-19 deaths while 95 (20%) are COVID-19 related deaths.




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 15 March 2021

The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.

Today (15/03/2021), **501** calls were answered including **29** alerts.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 15 March 2021

A highest peak of **3485** (8%) cases was recorded during week 1 in 2021 (Figure 2).

Of the total confirmed cases, 26977 (65%) are in the 20-49 years agebrackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.

A total of **6662 (16%)** of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.

The under 5 years age group make up 947 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2611 (6%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 3: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 15 March 2021

To date, **321816** tests (including **11665** re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath and Central Veterinary laboratories.

Since the beginning of the outbreak, **75106** contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, **658** new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 14 regions.

Cumulatively, 70882 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 10383 (25%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.

Today, 2731 (68%) out of 3998 active contacts monitored.

A total of **1594** people are currently in quarantine, with **116** new admissions.
