HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (22/03/2021)

- A total of 42771 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- More male cases 21591 (50%) were recorded compared to female cases 21180 (50%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1914 (4%) are Health Workers (HWs).
 - 1505 (79%) State; 405 (21%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1810 (95%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 93%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 15990 (37%) and 7840 (18%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 402 (81%) are COVID-19 deaths while 96 (19%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 22 March 2021




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 22 March 2021

- A highest peak of 3485 (8%) cases was recorded during week 1 in 2021 (Figure 2).
- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (22/03/2021), 589 calls were answered including 23 alerts.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 27653 (65%) are in the 20-49 years agebrackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 7020 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 970 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2708 (6%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 3: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 22 March 2021

- To date, 332435 tests (including 11724 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care. NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath, Namibia Central Pathology and Central Veterinary laboratories
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 77287 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 75 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 11 regions.
- Cumulatively, 72245 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 10639 (25%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 3327 (3%) out of 4716 active contacts monitored.

- Since March 2020, 39988 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1890 people are currently in quarantine, with 23 new admissions.

- Honourable Minister of Health and Social Services launched a national COVID-19 vaccination programme in Windhoek.
- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- Lack of isolation units and facilities for cases detected in boarding schools.
- Non-adherence to COVID-19 prevention measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for cases in schools.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
