HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (17/04/2021)

- A total of 46655 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- Cases are equally distributed by gender at 50%.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 2013 (4%) are Health Workers.
 - 1585 (79%) State; 424 (21%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1941 (96%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 95%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 16761 (36%) and 8363 (18%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 490 (81%) are COVID-19 deaths while 114 (19%) are COVID-19 related deaths.




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 17 April 2021

The highest peaks of 3463 (7%) and 3485 (8%) cases were recorded during week 53 of 2020 and 1 of 2021 respectively (Figure 1).




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases
17 April 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 29566 (63%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **8141 (17%)** of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1068 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 3011 (6%) are above 60 years of age.

- To date, 367580 tests (including 11868 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath, Namibia Central Pathology and Central Veterinary laboratories
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 85403 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 95 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 6 regions.
- Cumulatively, 80807 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 11703 (25%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 2608 (69%) out of 3778 active contacts monitored.

- A total of 1577 people are currently in quarantine, with 18 new admissions.

CHALLENGES

- Lack of isolation units and facilities for cases detected in boarding schools and police holding cells.
- Non-adherence to COVID-19 prevention measures by the general public.
