- A total of 44886 cases have been recorded todate, representing 2% of the population.
- Cases are equally distributed by gender at 50%.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1974 (4%) are Health Workers.
 - 1552 (79%) State; 418 (21%) Private, 4
 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1941 (98%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 94%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 16403 (37%) and 8066 (18%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 437 (81%) are COVID-19 deaths while 101 (19%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

- To date, 349387 tests (including 11788 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath, Namibia Central Pathology and Central Veterinary laboratories
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 81282 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 116 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 10 regions.
- Cumulatively, 76659 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 11424 (25%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 2516 (60%) out of 4208 active contacts monitored.




Figure 1: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 04 April 2021




Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 04 April 2021

A highest peak of 3485 (8%) cases was recorded during week 1 in 2021 (Figure 2).

- Since March 2020,
 41922 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1417 people are currently in quarantine, with 203 new admissions.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 28668 (64%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 7646 (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1026 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2866 (6%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 04 April 2021

RECOMMENDATIONS


- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for cases detected in schools and police holding cells.
