# **HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (30/04/2021)**

- A total of 48902 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- Cases are equally distributed by gender at 50%.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 2095 (4%) are Health Workers.
  - 1649 (79%) State; 442 (21%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
  - 2005 (96%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 95%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 17332 (35%) and 8665 (18%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 531 (82%) are COVID-19 deaths while 119 (18%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

- To date, 386940 tests (including 11931 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath, Namibia Central Pathology, Highcare and Central Veterinary laboratories
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 88630 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified,
   358 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 11 regions.
- Cumulatively, 83835 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 12317 (25%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 2625 (65%) out of 4022 active contacts monitored.




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 30 April 2021

- The highest peaks of 3463 (7%) and 3485 (7%) cases were recorded during week 53 of 2020 and 1 of 2021 respectively (Figure 1).
- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (30/04/2021), 317 calls were answered including 19 alerts.

- Since March 2020, 45271 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1440 people are currently in quarantine, with 121 new admissions.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 30729 (63%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 8681 (18%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1109 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 3232 (7%) are above 60 years of age.





Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases
30 April 2021






Figure 3: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 30 April 2021

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for cases detected in schools and police holding cells.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
