
- A total of 116 603 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 5% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 61 628 (53%) have been recorded compared to male cases 54 975 (47%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 3 943 (3%) are Health Workers.
  - 3 285 (83%) State; 650 (16%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
  - 3 475 (88) recoveries and 13 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 80%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 40 462 (35%) and 17 166 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 2 568 (91%) are COVID-19 deaths while 243 (9%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2.4%.

- Today (23/07/2021), 409 calls were answered including 9 alerts.

Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 23 July 2021



- Since March 2020, 67 726 people have been placed into quarantine around the country.
- A total of 4 014 people are currently in quarantine, with 195 new admissions.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 70 576 (61%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **18 591 (16%)** of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 473 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 11 074 (9%) are above 60 years of age.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of fourteen (14) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP (including Oshakati), Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory and Medlink Laboratory Services.
- To date, 598 497 tests (including 13 695 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 128 112 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 279 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 10 regions.
- Cumulatively, 121 715 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 140 contacts are lost to followup and a total of 21 589 (19) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 2 268 (44%) out of 5 143 active contacts were monitored.

- The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.
