
- A total of 116 964 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 5% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 61 841 (53%) have been recorded compared to male cases 55 123 (47%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 3 952 (3%) are Health Workers.
  - 3 294 (83%) State; 650 (16%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
  - 3 475 (88) recoveries and 13 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 80%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 40 493 (35%) and 17 210 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 2 591 (91%) are COVID-19 deaths while 243 (9%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2.4%.

- Today (24/07/2021), **489** calls were answered including **7** alerts.

- Since March 2020, 67 726 people have been placed into quarantine around the country.
- A total of 3 988 people are currently in quarantine, with 0 new admissions.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 70 672 (60%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **18 631 (16%)** of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 491 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 11 142 (10%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 24 July 2021

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of fourteen (14) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP (including Oshakati), Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory and Medlink Laboratory Services.
- To date, **599 934** tests (including **13 711** re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 128 144 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 32 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 8 regions.
- Cumulatively, 121 796 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 140 contacts are lost to followup and a total of 21 605 (18%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 593 (12%) out of 5 094 active contacts were monitored.

- > The COVID-19 vaccination programme is ongoing throughout the country
- The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.
