

#### Key Highlights


On 20<sup>th</sup> September 2022, the Ministry of Health declared an outbreak of Sudan ebolavirus (EVD) after a case managed at Mubende Regional Referral Hospital (MRRH) in Mubende district was confirmed through testing at the Uganda Virus Research Institute (UVRI). This follows investigations by the National Rapid Response Team of suspicious deaths that had occurred in the district earlier in the month. This is the first time in more than a decade that Uganda reports an outbreak of Sudan ebolavirus.

- Two new EVD confirmed and no new deaths in the past 24 hours.
- CFR among confirmed is 09/43 (20.9%)
- Contacts follow-up rate was 60%.
- Total of Ten healthcare workers infected, with three deaths.

#### Actions to date

The Ministry of Health (MoH), Districts, and partners in Uganda are implementing several outbreak control interventions in Mubende and her surrounding districts to contain the disease spread. An overview of key activities is summarized below:

#### 3.1 Coordination

The WHO AFRO Regional Emergency Director visited Madudu sub-county and the ETU, also attended the daily DTF meeting chaired by the RDC at Mubende district.

Daily DTF meetings held in all four affected districts, as being chaired by the respective RDCs.

#### 3.2 Surveillance and Contact Tracing

- Contacts under active follow-up are 884 of which 529 were followed up in the last 24 hours, translating to a 60.0% follow-up rate for the day.
- Total alerts verified in the past 24 hours were 16 of which 08 (50.0%) met suspect case definition.
- Received a total of 11 VHF alerts from other regions of the country including the districts Kiryandongo (01), Kayunga (01), Kampala (02), Gulu (01), Omoro (01), Arua (01), Kotido (01), Nakapiripirit (01), Moroto (01) and Nabilatuk (01). All of these tested NEGATIVE by PCR for Ebola, Marburg, CCHF and RVF viruses.

#### 3.3 Laboratory

The on-site mobile testing laboratory is currently functional at the Mubende RR Hospital. Turn-around time is currently six hours. Total samples processed in past 24 hours were 26.

#### 3.4 Case management

- Solution to the second struct was assessed for suitability of an EVD isolation centre
- Received additional human resources from UPDF in the ETU.

#### **3.5 Emergency Medical Services**

Responded to zero requests for inter-facility transfers, two intra-facility transfer and evacuated five suspected cases from communities of Kagadi (01), Kiryandongo (01) and Mubende (03).

#### 3.6 Infection Prevention and Control, WASH, Safe and Dignified Burials

- Oriented 13 healthcare workers on EVD standard case definition, Alert verification, reporting, Contact tracing and Infection prevention and control in Bunyangabu district.
- Trained the safe and dignified burial team in Kassanda district.

#### 3.7 Risk communication, social mobilization and community engagement

- Four local radio stations (Point FM, Mubende FM, Heart FM and Tropical FM) and all village community radios are currently running daily talk-shows and spot announcements on EVD awareness; government radio talk-show airtime allocated to EVD awareness by RDC in Kyegegwa.
- EVD awareness messages running on at least ten community tower radio stations
- Five film vans deployed in Mubende, Kagadi, Kyegegwa and Kasanda districts undertaking community sensitization and mobilization.

#### **3.8 Logistics**

Response in Mubende currently has a fleet of 32 vehicles and nine ambulances from MoH and partners

#### 4. Key Messaging

People in the community should call an alert hotline or go to a health facility if they have symptoms (e.g., fever, headache, weakness, vomiting, bloody diarrhea or urine, bleeding from body openings).
