#### Key Highlights

On 20<sup>th</sup> September 2022, the Ministry of Health declared an outbreak of Sudan ebolavirus (EVD) after a case managed at Mubende Regional Referral Hospital (MRRH) in Mubende district was confirmed through testing at the Uganda Virus Research Institute (UVRI). This follows investigations by the National Rapid Response Team of suspicious deaths that had occurred in the district earlier in the month. This is the first time in more than a decade that Uganda reports an outbreak of Sudan ebolavirus.

- Zero new EVD confirmed cases and one new deaths in the past 24 hours, which happened among a healthcare worker.
- CFR among confirmed is 10/43 (22.3%)
- Contacts follow-up rate was 78.5%.
- Ten healthcare workers infected, with four deaths.





Figure 2: Trend in Confirmed cases



#### Actions to date

The Ministry of Health (MoH), Districts, and partners in Uganda are implementing several outbreak control interventions in Mubende and her surrounding districts to contain the disease spread. An overview of key activities is summarized below:
