

Key Highlights

On 20th September 2022, the Ministry of Health declared an outbreak of Sudan ebolavirus (EVD) after a case managed at Mubende Regional Referral Hospital (MRRH) in Mubende district was confirmed through testing at the Uganda Virus Research Institute (UVRI). This follows investigations by the National Rapid Response Team of suspicious deaths that had occurred in the district earlier in the month. This is the first time in more than a decade that Uganda reports an outbreak of Sudan ebolavirus.

- Six new EVD confirmed cases with two new confirmed deaths in the past 24 hours, all from Mubende district.
- All new confirmed cases were known contacts of a confirmed case.
- Cumulative confirmed cases currently are 54
- CFR among confirmed is 19/54 (35%).
- Contacts follow-up rate in the past 24 hours was 94%.





Figure 1: Trend in confirmed cases of Sudan Ebolavirus as of 10th October 2022

Critical Challenges listed

- Some communities still exhibit a poor perception towards EVD response, sometimes resulting in hostility to responders
- Families affected by Ebola are still stigmatized by the communities, EVD suspects and survivors still face rejection within the communities.
- Low stocks of response supplies including gumboots, scrub-suits, JIK, digital thermometers, handwashing facilities, gloves, spray pumps, bins (large-240ltrs and small 120ltrs), infra-red thermometers, googles, among others

Key messages to the public

- People in the community should call an alert hotline or go to a health facility if they have symptoms (e.g., fever, headache, weakness, vomiting, bloody diarrhoea or urine, bleeding from body openings).
