



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Background


On 20th September 2022, the Ministry of Health declared an outbreak of Sudan ebolavirus (SVD) after a case managed at Mubende Regional Referral Hospital (MRRH) in Mubende district was confirmed through testing at the Uganda Virus Research Institute (UVRI). This followed investigations by the National Rapid Response Team of suspicious deaths that had occurred in the district earlier in the month. This is the first time in more than a decade that Uganda reports an outbreak of Sudan ebolavirus

Key Highlights



- Case Fatality Ratio (CFR) among confirmed Figure: Time analysis of affected individuals by status cases is 55/141 (39%).
- A total of 607 contacts actively being followed-up in seven districts, follow-up rate in the past 24 hours was 85%.

Actions to date

The Ministry of Health (MoH), Districts, and partners in Uganda are implementing several outbreak control interventions in Mubende and her surrounding districts to contain the disease spread. An overview of key activities is summarized below:

Key messages to the public

- People in the community should call an alert hotline or go to a health facility if they have symptoms (e.g., fever, headache, weakness, vomiting, bloody diarrhoea or urine, bleeding from body openings).
- Hotline numbers are: 0800200043 for Mubende and Kassanda; 0800299000 for Kampala Metropolitan Area, 0800300043 for Masaka, 0800355411 for Kagadi all toll-free, and 0787437139 for Bunyangabu (not toll-free).
- Free alert SMS on 6767 starting with the 'ALERT' key word; Free alert SMS to U-report on 8500
- Community should not fear people who have been discharged from the ETU and returned home.
