The mission included high-level meetings, field visits, and engagements with partners and staff underscoring WHO's commitment to supporting South Africa's leadership in regional public health.














COURTESY CALL ON THE MINISTER OF HEALTH

Dr Mohamed Janabi held an interactive engagement with the WHO staff, where he applauded staff for their commitment and resilience during the ongoing restructuring process.



As part of the Strategic Leadership Forum 2025 and 2gether4SRHR partnership, supported by Sweden, Dr Mohamed Janabi joined other Regional Directors of the UN Regional Programme including UNAIDS, UNFPA, and UNICEF in a meeting with the Swedish Ambassador to South Africa to reaffirm joint efforts to advance sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR) across the region.
