Request to submit a statement by accredited non-State actors at sessions of the WHO Regional Committee for Africa

The statement should not raise issues of a political nature that are unrelated to the agenda item and should not contain any inappropriate or offensive reference to Member States. While there should be no reference to any individual Member State or areas of Member States, it is recalled that nomenclature must follow that of the United Nations.

The Chairperson of the Regional Committee decides whether or not to accord the accredited non-State actors the right to make its oral statement during the session in light of its relevance to the discussion, the time constraints or any other reason.

The statement is posted on the website of the WHO Regional Office for Africa for a limited time period as determined by the Secretariat, and will not be retained thereafter.

Statement (in English, French or Portuguese): We welcome the African Progress Report on the
Regional work for Integrating Essential NCD Services in Primary Health Care (2017-2030). We share
its call for accelerated and innovative action to close persistent gaps in service coverage, access to
medicines, and health workforce capacity. Evidence based self-care interventions including responsible
use of non-prescription medicines, health technologies, lifestyle practices, and preventative actions enable
people to prevent and manage conditions such as cardiovascular disease, diabetes, respiratory, cancer, oral health, and mental health. Community level access to self-care products reduces the need
for hospital or doctor visits, which are often time consuming and costly for individuals
and systems. These everyday actions complement formal healthcare services, extend care beyond clinic
settings, and help reduce key NCDs. Evidence demonstrates that self-care including the responsible use of non-prescription medicines delivers substantial cost and time savings. In Sub-Saharan Africa alone
t is already generating \$1 billion in annual healthcare savings, while saving 141 million hours for individua
and 7 million hours for physicians. These benefits can support efforts to expand NCD services, reduce
workforce pressure, improve medicine access and advance prevention strategies. To unlock the full
potential of self-care we urge stakeholders to: 1) Invest in self-care infrastructure: access to products
_digital tools and education; 2) Integrate self-care into national NCD and PHC strategies; 3) Reform
financing models to include and incentivise self-care; 4) Strengthen workforce planning to align clinical expertise with complex care while supporting self-management
